- ❖ It was a sweet and short meeting of 2 hours and 40 minutes.
- ❖ A motion was moved and passed to have a flat rate and it is referred to Law Committee.

- ❖ Three Law Committees were appointed:

  - Brandie Piper of Illinois
- ❖ CAAD discussed and voted on 3 proposals from NEAAD that will be moved at NSAD.
- ❖ An out of order motion was moved to have CAAD Softball Tournament to go back to Labor Day Weekend.
- ❖ One day or two days CAAD Softball Tournament was referred to Coach/Manager Meeting.
  - At Coach/Manager Meeting, it was voted to have 2 days tournament.
- ❖ The Champion Softball Field halted any of CAAD Teams to use USSSA Bats at this field after few games were played, because of their Insurance specified only ASA Bats is allowed and prohibited any USSSA bats. USSSA playing rules was used at CAAD Softball Tournament, except for the USSSA bats.

Five teams of Chicago Catholic Ephpheta, West Suburban Association of the Deaf Men team and Women team, Detroit, and Chi-Town will have to keep swinging at National Softball Association of the Deaf this coming August 6 - 8, 2009 at Fort Lauderdale, Florida.
