The summer has fully heated up with temperatures of over 90 degree along with high humidity that had produced the heating index temperatures over 100 degree during the weekend with a thunderstorm on Sunday morning which had delayed the games, but managed to play a full schedule of games that all teams in Central Athletic Association of the Deaf (CAAD) had the swing of things in our 62nd year of Softball Tournament hosted by Detroit Association of the Deaf (DAD) during the weekend of July 22- 24, 2005.

With 393 registered participants including the players and committees on hand, seven Men teams and three Women teams participated in CAAD Softball Tournament.

Chicago Catholic Ephpheta (CCE) went undefeated to clinch the Championship for the third straight years and had drowned West Suburban Association of the Deaf (WSAD) during the Championship Game with score of 20 to 0 in second innings that WSAD could not keep up the pace and threw a flag to end the game to award CCE the Championship. WSAD Men ousted DAD to eliminated DAD in Third Place with score of 25 – 17; meanwhile, Greater Milwaukee Association of the Deaf (GMAD) suffered a loss with only two runs of 9 - 7 to DAD and placed in Fourth Place and was awarded Team Sportsmanship for their efforts. The Most Valuable Player went to John Little of CCE.

WSAD Women Team continued to capture the Championship for the ninth straight years and eliminated GMAD, who had poured out their hearts to play at their best and never gave up but their innings had run out, remained in Second Place for the fourth years with score of 9 - 3. Rachel Hamilton of WSAD had a fine performance and received Most Valuable Player award. Team Sportsmanship was awarded to Pittsburgh Team.

 1. Task Force- there no action was taken because due to the transition period for the new officers.
Reading of the minutes was accepted as it is.

Reports from the CAAD Officers:

Commissioner: Bonnie R. Schwebke

Welcomed to 62nd Annual CAAD Softball Tournament hosted by Detroit Association of the Deaf and thanked DAD and its committees, especially Chris Schlutz, for their tireless efforts and hours of preparation to host this Softball Tournament.

Announced that CAAD had increased Softball Team this year with 7 Men and 3 Women and heartily welcomed Pittsburgh and Columbus after few years of absence.

Informed that the transaction of Old Officers to New Officers was effectively and CAAD Secretary-Treasurer have turned over a total of 14 boxes in organized of CAAD Files from 1944 to present and Property to Denise's residence.

Profoundly thanked Neal McKenize and Wally Jones for their advises and helps over the years.

Thanked Denise Johnson for her well motivation and determination to do well in her position as CAAD Secretary-Treasurer. Denise is a fast learner and I have the confidence that she will do well in her position.

Informed the issue of Larry Traynor's outstanding debt for the computer that he had bid years ago is resolved.

Asked for the feedback in regarding of GIDC hosting CAAD Basketball Tournament next year in March 2006 that GIDC continued wanted to host the Ballroom at their Clubhouse.

Informed that Law Committees have not yet appointed and will finalized the appointed of Law Committees this weekend.

Informed the issue of "re-register CAAD for 501c3" is being pending. A new form was sent to CAAD in regarding of Fund Raising that CAAD had no idea of what is going on. With the consulting from Rick Balk, who had founded 501c3, had no idea about it either, but with an advice from Rick Balk, who had founded 501c3, that he had no idea either. CAAD will check this out and to see what CAAD can do about it.

Briefly informed the results of USADB Basketball Tournament and congratulated GIDC as Runner Up and WSAD as 7th Place.

- ❖ Thanked both Kevin Smith and Julia Anderson to Representative for CAAD.
- ❖ Thanked Kevin Smith as CAAD Delegate at USADB and he will give you the report next March 2006.
- ❖ Important information from Kevin Smith's Report that USADB had overpowered Region's votes of 6 favored to disaffiliate USADSF until USADB could find Insurance first before USADB can disaffiliate USADSF.
- ❖ Tentative 2006 USADB Basketball Tournament hosting at St. Lois, Missouri during the weekend of April 6 – 8, 2006.
- ❖ Buffalo Old Timers barked at CAAD for not retaining Buffalo in CAAD Region, this is to assure you all that for Basketball, Buffalo should still be AFFILIATED with CAAD, but for Softball, Buffalo is affiliated with ESAD.

Announced the disappointment of Michiana and Detroit Deaf City Teams have folded because they do not want to participate NSAD but they wanted to participate CAAD ONLY and learned that they still have to pay for NSAD Fees regardless that they do not want to go to NSAD at all.

- ❖ According to the researching, I learned that the Hearing Softball Teams has same problems as their numbers of teams in their Tournament have dwindling over the years.
 - Years ago, it only needs 1 Sponsor to support a team to participate the Softball Tournament at Hearing Tournament, but for now, it needs 3 Sponsors to support 1 team to participate the Softball Tournament. Therefore, it is the money issue that is the reason for dwindling softball teams.

Announced that NSAD had disaffiliated USADSF and shared the important information:

- ❖ NSAD had increased Players Fee from \$5.00 to \$15.00
- ❖ Needed to find out what is the breakdown of that \$15.00 per player that goes to according to NSAD Bylaw shown on Power Point.
- ❖ To register NSAD Softball Tournament to participate, EVERY team needs to pay \$250, then what is \$1.00 of Prizes for Men and Women from NSAD Breakdown of \$15.00 shown in their Bylaws will go?
- ❖ Encouraged you to do your HOMEWORK before going to NSAD and to ask where does \$15.00 go to?
- ❖ Informed that NSAD has a poor two ways communication and poor duties.
 - NSAD did not confirm the 2005 NSAD Softball Tournament a year ahead according to their Bylaws.
 - NSAD Secretary-Treasurer mailed the Softball Packet in late April 2005 with ONLY 30 Men Forms, 1 Women Form, NO COED Form and 2 NSAD Flyers AFTER I had asked for 60 Men Forms and 30 Women and COED Forms in early April 2005.
 - NSAD forgot to include COED Forms which is the reason why the CAAD Softball Packet was mailed out in May 2005 after reminding NSAD TWO TIMES to mail CAAD the COED Forms.
 - Should CAAD pay for making the copies of NSAD Flyer?

- NSAD reluctant to respond both Neal McKenzie and my emails to give us the status of their investigation of Buffalo Players and that Buffalo should start to play for ESAD in 2006, but Buffalo is playing at ESAD this year, which was moved and passed at NSAD Softball Council Meeting. No response and/or communication from NSAD about those two issues after emailing them more than once.
- What is good to have NSAD Softball Council Meeting if that motion(s) was moved and passed BUT NSAD hardly abided it?
- Most important: You ALL need to bark at NSAD to follow their Bylaws!
- Informed that NSAD will no longer provide the Hotel Rooms and Rental car for the Region's Championship Teams. Instead of that, NSAD will give out the Traveling Prizes based on each Team Entry Fee of \$250.
 - The Total of Traveling Prizes is \$12,200.00 based on 48 teams of both Men and Women. (Showed Power Point of Traveling Prizes).
 - Denise Johnson will give you the instruction of how to register to participate NSAD Softball Tournament this August at Biloxi/Gulfport, Mississippi.

Deputy Commissioner: Scott Bradach

Scott thanked Chris Schultz and Jerry B and DAD, its committees for CAAD hostship preparations. We want to be sure that all of the players/fans acquaintance them with your thanks and appreciation.

We will not have any Hall of Fame inductees due to no nomination. We will do again the fall for next year 2006 CAAD Basketball. Big congrats to all Detroit Hall of Famers. They have 5 Sport leaders, 1 is Basketball player, 1 Softball Coach/Manager and 21 Softball players. Few come from nearby Flint. Last time DAD hosted was in 1993, which they placed 2nd. 5th time overall host and in 1944 was DAD and CAAD's 1st host at Detroit.

Silver Pass cards were given to Wally Jones and Neal McKenzie. In recognition of your meritorious services, this card entitles you to attend all CAAD tournament activities, meetings and exercise your rights of voice and voting privileges as Delegate-at-Large.

7 Men & 3 Women... total numbers not too bad despite few teams backed out. Don't be too disappointed since these team numbers fare average with 7 other regions. We need to stress on recruiting process, make improvements and be more involved in softball playing for just summer fun that can lead us all to CAAD and NSAD. Focus on team leadership(s) ... takes a teamwork and motivation...not just 1 individual so help each other. Lack of funds the main cause/reason for numbers of team dwindling? Ideal fundraiser plans such as car wash, raffle tickets, candy sales, spaghetti/fish fry dinners, 50/50 sales, softball/bowling/darts/etc... tourneys and poker nights.

We CAAD officers do care! WE are here to help so ask us! Good luck to all teams and enjoy your weekend.

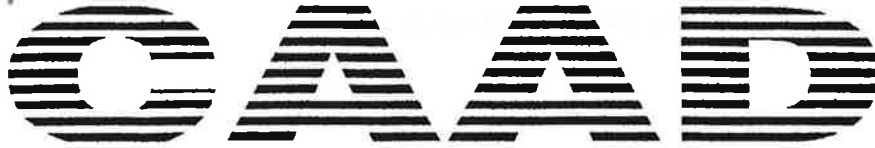

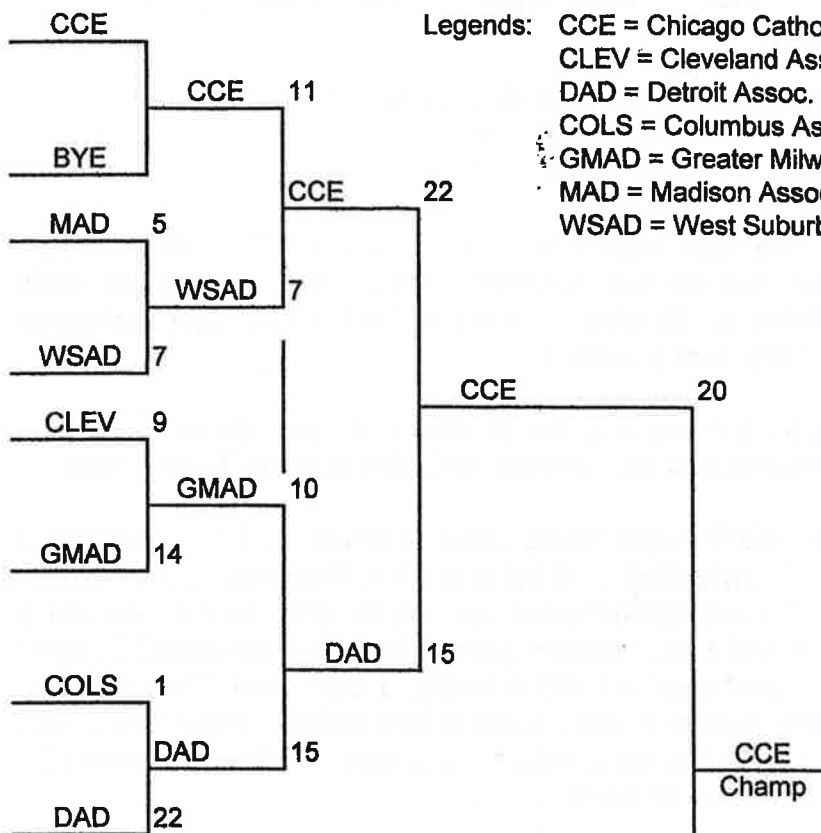
Rachel Hamilton of WSAD received the Most Valuable Player award.

Team Sportsmanship was awarded to Pittsburgh Team.

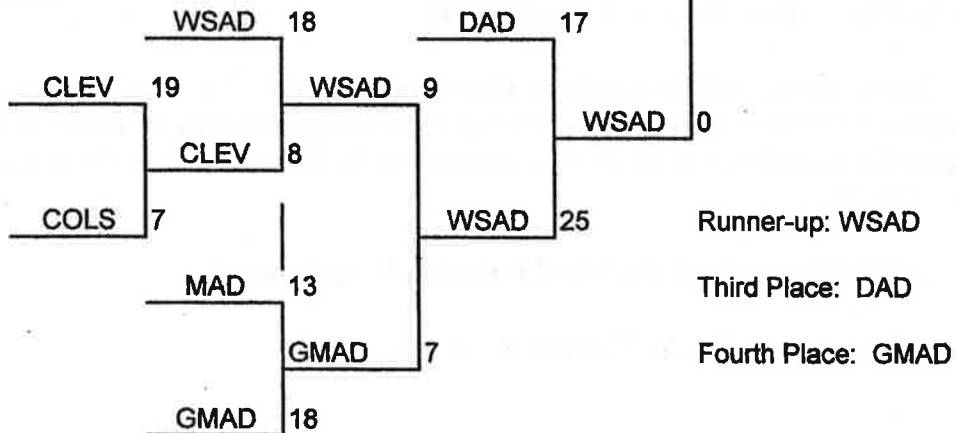

Winners' Bracket



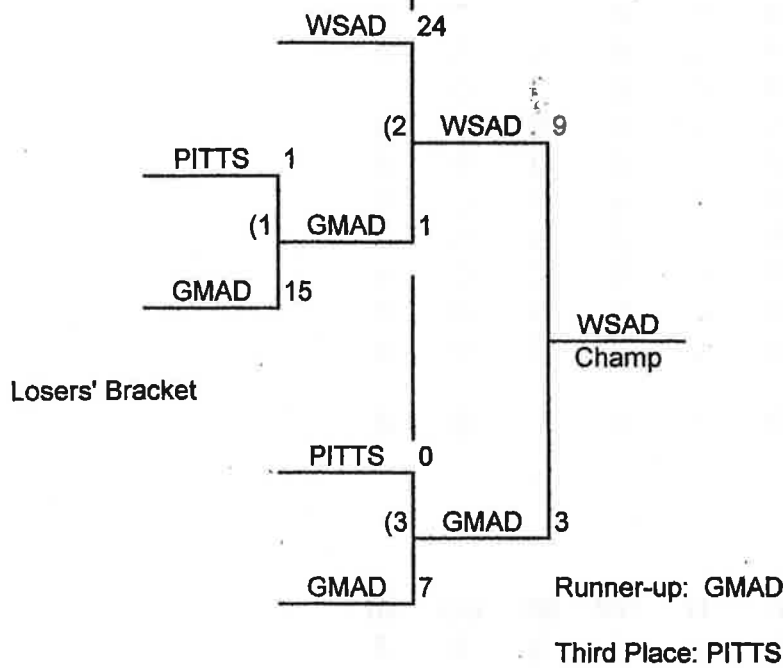
Losers' Bracket

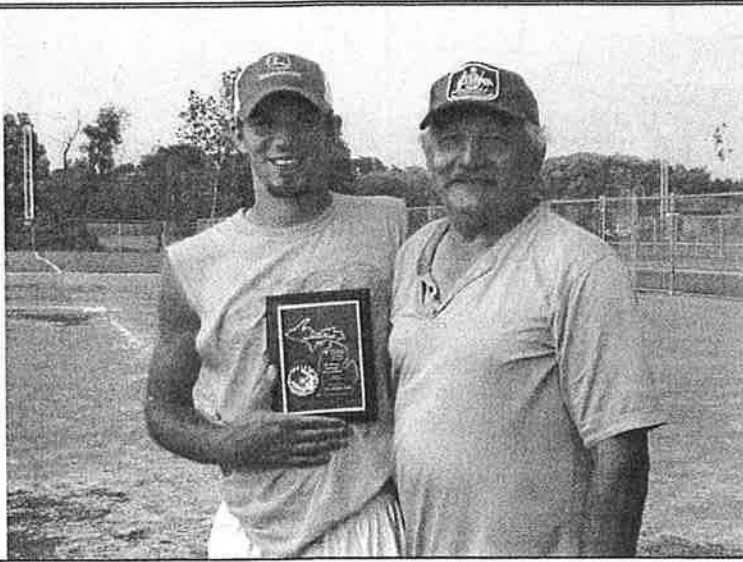

Commissioner Report of 2005 NSAD Softball Tournament

Biloxi/Gulfport, Mississippi

August 4 – 6, 2005

Within a shy of 3 weeks before the Hurricane Katrina had slammed Biloxi/Gulfport, Mississippi and New Orleans, Louisiana, the National Softball Association of the Deaf (NSAD) hosted 30th Men's and 19th Women's Annual National Slo-Pitch Tournament at Biloxi/Gulfport, Mississippi under the sweltering hot sun, with the combination of heat and high humidity during the first weekend of August. In no doubts, it had impacted a lot of participants and spectators who were at Headquarter Hotel of Imperial Palace at Biloxi, had played at Gulfport Softball Complex at Gulfport, and drove on I-10 Highway to transport from Biloxi to Gulfport to learn that those had completely wiped out from the Hurricane Katrina.

Just like the Hurricane Katrina, the Maryland Eagles Men Team and Maryland Timberfest Women Team had clobbered Chicago Catholic Ephpheta (CCE) Men Team and West Suburban Association of the Deaf (WSAD) Women Team from claiming the Championships at NSAD. Both CCE and WSAD had battled fiercely, eyeing the Championship and putted all of their best efforts to fight all the way, but both CCE and WSAD had lost a game during the Double Elimination Tournament, meanwhile both Maryland Eagles and Timberfest have not lost a game and had orchestrated all the way to Championship game.

During the NSAD Board of Directors and Softball Council Meetings, all of the Regions have shared their tournaments results, their concerns and issues ranged from lack of teams, NSAD not abiding their NSAD Bylaws, lack of two ways communication between NSAD and the Regions and just two of the Regions have split into Softball and Basketball (NWAAD and FAAD).

In issue of realigning Regions, representing as CAAD Delegate, I have fought hard to retain Pittsburgh to stay within CAAD and not to be realigned to ESAD; however, it is being referred to Law Committee after I brought it up at Softball Council Meeting which one of the NSAD Officer cleverly had moved to refer to Law Committee before it could be voted by the Delegates. Not only that, NSAD had moved and "ordered" ESAD to merge with NEAAD which had caused a lot of chaos between ESAD and NEAAD as both ESAD and NEAAD have no interests to merge at all. In fact, NSAD unfairly made those realigning against NEAAD, ESAD and CAAD's Constitutions and Bylaws.

Politically incorrectly, NSAD is so opinionated and decided the best interest to realign "FOR" the Regions regardless of Region's Constitutions and Bylaws. Right now the legitimacy of NSAD's ineffectively and ordering are in doubt in to realigning the Regions. Presenting CAAD's argument, I have emailed NSAD on August 9, 2005 pointing out that NSAD could not "overpowering" or/and "ordering" against the Region's Constitutions and Bylaws to realign, the ball is still in NSAD's court now, as I have not heard from NSAD to response my email ever since.

Beside that realigning issues, the fees for the players of \$15 and the team Fee of \$250 has not yet answered in clarification and pertaining to any of us as NSAD presented their argument that they no longer charged the players \$15 each to participate NSAD Softball Tournament but NSAD is charging per team \$250 instead for the Traveling Expense Prizes.

During the NSAD Softball Tournament, there was a lot of disputing about some of the Umpires made several obviously wrong calls and that some of the Umpires have had changed their calls after listening to the opposite team or someone else which had caused a lot of controversy of their qualifications, knowledge and capability to umpire the games.

Overall, the NSAD Softball Tournament had managed to play a full schedule of games that all the teams had the swing of things with a slightly delayed for about 2 hours. The Championship games and Award Ceremony had attracted a lot of spectators crammed under the shelters and shades that were played in the late afternoon along with presenting the Hall of Fame Inductees to Daniel Buchholz, Daniel Fine, Dan Hall, and Tracy Smith, all were presented except for Tracey Smith.
