Subject: Recognition on History of Women's Softball

To NSAD Board of Directors,

I, NSAD Commissioner, have decided to recognize the Women's National Softball History from 1976 to 1986.

I strongly feel that Women's History should be recognized immediately from 1976 to 1986. There are no reasons to deny the history of Women's National softball.

In 1976, there are two regions that did have the Women's softball tournament (CAAD and old SWAAD). They did send their regional champions to the inaugural AAAD Softball tournament. Unfortunately, no other regional tournament had women's tournament. The result - Detroit defeated Dallas.

In 1977, NEAAD send Hartford to the AAAD's 2nd Annual Softball tournament with Detroit, Dallas and Houston. Dallas won the tournament.

In 1978, MAAD send Kansas City to AAAD with 5 other teams from these regions: SWAAD, CAAD and NEAAD. Detroit defeated Revere.

In 1979, there were 13 Women's teams at the AAAD National Softball Tournament.

In 1985, it was the largest number of Women's played in AAAD history. They have brought 17 teams while the Men's had only 16 teams.

I strongly feel that we should recognize the Women's champions: Detroit, Dallas, Houston, Grand Rapids and Pierce Valley from 1976 to 1986.

We do have some women Hall of Famers who played during that era (Tina Takacs and Sandy Hart) and we need these tournaments to be recognized by us.

Also we will celebrate Women's 25th anniversary. We will be using pink softballs for this year only. We will have the NSAD Hall of Fame inductees (only Women's). After that we will then resume the NSAD Hall of Fame ceremony for both women's and men's next year.

After that event, we will start with the 37th Annual NSAD Tournament for all divisions next year.

The NSAD Executive Board has supported my decision. Now I am asking you to favor my decision to recognize the history of Women's Softball National Tournament. They do really deserve to be recognized!
